MENTORING PROGRAM: Are you new to quilting and want to learn? Do you need help with a project? Come to Saturday Sew & Project Day and get the help you need!

I remember how I struggled teaching myself to quilt in the 80's. Finding a mentor in the early 90's made all the difference. I'm excited about this program and look forward to helping you on your quilting journey.

Beginning in February, I will conduct a refresher course on different aspects of quilting. Each month from 10am to 11am, you will learn helpful tips and techniques. The first course will be on the rotary cutter, cutting mat and acrylic ruler.
