Please join us the second Thursday of every month at 6:30pm at Northwood Community Center, 2409 Ambassador Ct, High Point, NC 27265. This site is on the corner of Eastchester and Ambassador, very near to the old Dragonfly Quilt Shop. Our meetings are virtual (online through an email invite) and in person. To receive an invite to a virtual meeting, please call or email an officer in the guild before the next meeting.

From our President, Kelly:

Will the sun ever shine again? While I am stuck indoors, I am going to plan projects for spring, including my 2023 Pantone Color of the Year entry for our challenge. Remember that the guild's mission statement includes the promotion of fiber arts, and that will extend to the challenge. You may make a quilt, a wall hanging, a quilted item, or even a knitted hat for your entry! Use your skills and your passion to make something that speaks to you. Remember that the point of the challenge is to inspire you to use a color you might not usually use – to get you out of your comfort zone, to think outside the box. The entries are due at the December 2023 guild meeting, and we will be voting on our favorites. There will be prizes, so don't show your entry to others, or at show and tell so that we won't know who made what. I am looking forward to seeing what everyone creates!

PLEASE TRY to make it to our February meeting on Zoom. Not only because we have the great program listed below, but because we will be voting on an amendment to the by-laws as follows:

AMENDMENT TWELVE: This amendment replaces the entire paragraph under Article XI-Contracts, Checks and Drafts. The President, with consent of the Guild membership, will be authorized to enter contracts on behalf of the Guild. This consent will be determined by majority vote of the quorum present when said contracts are proposed. The President is authorized to give written permission to any other elected officer to sign any approved contract instead of the President. The board will approve a yearly budget to cover the cost of Guild-related functions. Although any elected officer is authorized to write checks and drafts on behalf of the Guild, it is preferred that this be done by either the Treasurer or President. Any check up to the amount of \$500.00 may be signed solely by any elected officer of the board, but preferably the Treasurer. Any check over \$500.00 must bear the signature of two elected officers of the board, with one of those elected officers preferably being the Treasurer.

It is important that we have your input and vote on this amendment.

We have set Board Meeting dates for April 17, July 24, and October 2, 2023 at 6pm. Remember that you do not have to be on the board to attend the meetings.

We have been unable to secure the technology or the manpower to conduct guild meetings by both Zoom and in-person at Northwoods Community Center simultaneously. I hope you will continue to come to the guild meetings on Zoom in February, March and November of this year. **Because we will not meet in person as expected, you may bring your donations for the Community Pantry to the April meeting.** The donations that we chose for each month for 2023 are as follows:

January – beans

February – bath products (shampoo, conditioner, lotion, shaving cream, etc.)

March – international foods

April – canned meat

May – pasta

June – feminine products

July – canned or dried fruit

August – snacks

September – crackers

October – a kid's coat

November – soup

December – macaroni and cheese

I like to write each item at the top of my grocery list for the month and grab some each time I go so that I won't forget.

This is a copy of the information that was sent to the participants last time to tell them about the spot:

We have found a sewing spot for the Spring Retreat! This is the “recreation center” of a local church that is not attached to the church building, but is across the property with its own parking lot. Come and sew for as long as you wish on any or all days, and spend the night at your own home. All sewing equipment will be locked in the room overnight, so you will not have to pack up each day. The room has three ground-level entrance doors; one is a double. There is a very large covered area with many picnic tables outside the door of the sewing room and there are several covered outlets there also, so sewing outside is also a possibility for those who are interested. Tables will be set up and there will be a raised cutting station and raised ironing station in the room. It is also a good idea to cut what you will need for your project beforehand. Because you will be going back to your own home each night, you can bring less each day and bring back new projects throughout the retreat if you wish. The sewing time will be from 9am – until the last person leaves. The church is 7 miles from the Walmart in High Point and 5 miles from the Walmart in Kernersville.

Each person attending will be required to write a check to the High Point Quilt Guild for **\$50**, which is due no later than **February 9, 2023** and which is **NON-REFUNDABLE**. This will permit you to come for as many or few days as you wish. If you pay but do not attend, your check will be considered a donation to the Guild.

There is a large kitchen attached to the sewing room. The kitchen does have two microwaves, one traditional coffee maker, one Keurig coffee maker, a refrigerator, sink and icemaker. It does not have a range or a dishwasher. You can eat breakfast at home or grab something on your way over in the morning. You can bring your own lunch or dinner each day or order out or have something delivered.
