Treasurer's Report – Sherri - The March Treasurer's Report was emailed to the membership. A motion by Alicia, seconded by Susan, to approve the Treasurer's Report was made. All in favor.

Program – Juanita re-introduced members to Sit and Sew. She reminded everyone that Sit and Sew is the Saturday after the Guild Meeting from 9am to 5 pm. It is \$5 to attend.

Juanita encouraged everyone to enter the President's Challenge. Winners will be decided by Viewer's Choice. She encouraged everyone to challenge themselves by focusing on mastering a task that they do not like.

2025 Fall Retreat - Sherri reminded everyone that the Registration and deposit are due immediately; your deposit reserves your spot.

High Point Quilt Guild Meeting Minutes May 8, 2025

President Juanita called the meeting to order welcoming members and visitors. She wished a happy birthday to Ellen.

President Juanita stated that the minutes for April would be included in the next newsletter.

Treasurer's Report – Sherri - The April Treasurer's Report was emailed to the membership. A motion by Alicia, seconded by MaryBeth to approve the Treasurer's Report was made. All in favor. Juanita encouraged members to pay their Membership Dues immediately and stated that those that have not paid did not receive the last Treasurer's Report.

Sherri announced that there is still room in the Haw River Fall Retreat. She stated that this is a fun time of sewing, knitting, quilting and fellowship. A deposit of \$70 is due in September. Sherri announced that the 2026 Retreat dates are Oct 22-25 and are after High Point Furniture Market, for those who have been unable to attend in the past because of timing conflicts.

Vice President Karen stated that she will create a committee to plan Guild programs for 2026, when she will be the new President. The committee will try to plan programs for twelve months and Karen is hoping that these will be set/scheduled by November of 2025.

Karen announced that the Sit and Hand Sew workshop will be May 17. Participants can use all types of hoops or frames and will learn all six types of hand quilting. This begins at 10am and is free. She will email a list of what to bring.

Karen stated that all are invited to Zoom and Sew on Tuesdays from 6p to 8p. Please send her an email if you are interested.

Charity Quilts – Juanita stated that everyone has worked so hard on charity quilts for cancer patients at the hospital and the Guild is very proud of the number of quilts we have given. She encouraged members to continue making lap size quilts and asked members to let her know if they need any materials.

Alicia announced that she will have a sewing machine repairman available at the August and September Sit and Sew meetings and that Kyle can fix the machines on the spot or take them in August and bring them back in September. He will be here August 16 and September 13 and will take cash, checks or credit card.

Juanita stated that Fiber Arts Day is scheduled for June 7 and asked any members who could assist to get in touch with Susan. This is at Jamestown Park and members will answer questions from the public, promote the guild, can do some hand sewing, and will generally "show off" our skills and passion for fiber arts. Please let Juanita know if you are interested.

Juanita announced that the operating hours for Sew Happy are changing to M-F from 12p to 5p, and Saturdays 12p to 3p. The owner has also shared some free patterns with us, which are on the free

table. This store is in the old Dragonfly location. Juanita said that members could carpool or have a field trip to the store on Sit and Sew days.

Juanita introduced Karen and her program "Template Stamps and Hand Piecing", and Karen spoke about and demonstrated hand sewing. She stated she found the "slowness" of hand work to be relaxing and stated this can be a passion for those who like to use their hands. She recommended the book "Piecing Fabrics and Mending Lives" and stated that you can both hand- and machine-piece your quilts. She showed options for completing projects, and stated that the benefits of handwork are that it is fun, easy, accurate and there are no quilt police. She showed and demonstrated stamps, showed some of her quilts, and brought kits for each member to practice on during the meeting. Stamps can be cleaned with baby wipes. The interesting and educational program was enjoyed by all.

Door prizes were awarded and Janet announced that the drawing for the raffle basket is at the next meeting.

Sherri announced that her contest entry for the anniversary of the Declaration of Independence was picked as the North Carolina Winner. Congratulations to Sherri and her block will tour large cities across the US, including the National Quilt Museum in Paducah, KY, the show in Houston and possibly the Smithsonian. She wrote a story about why she included each item on the block and the story will be on the back of the block.

Juanita encouraged everyone to enter the President's Challenge. Winners will be decided by Viewer's Choice. She encouraged everyone to challenge themselves by focusing on mastering a task that they do not like.
